Shuffle events tackle themes linked to innovative and avantgarde contemporary artistic practices that reflect today's society and contribute to strengthening collective \ awareness on current issues and to nurturing \(\) critical reflection. Shuffle is always part of a pre-existing event, such as a festival, an exhibition, or a conference. Its agile concept aims to create a sustainable network of cultural players and | people interested in contemporary art in Switzerland and abroad.















EMERGING ARTISTS



Emerging artists are an important part of Shuffle's concept. In November 2023, a call for projects was launched, to which more than 25 Swiss and international artists applied. A panel of 3 distinguished jurors, Claudia Popovici, Flexfab and Olivier Kaeser, selected 3 young artists who have been coached in the six months leading up to the festival. The artists Aya Metwalli, Jasper Mehler and the duo Flurina Zehnder and Valérian Bitschnau were asked to conceptualize and produce a work to be presented during the Usinesonore Festival. This process, which lasted several months, is designed to support the artists and encourage them in their thinking, while giving them an opportunity for exchange with the national art scene and the public.

Aya Metwalli (*1988) is an Egyptian vocalist, improviser and composer-performer skilled in singing microtonal Arabic magam.

Valérian Bitschnau (*1992) et Flurina Zehnder (*1997) both come from classical music backgrounds, and have worked together on a range of experimental projects exploring social issues and questioning the formats in which music is shared and listened to.

KOMÅ is an interdisciplinary studio located between South America and Switzerland. The studio combines food practices, artistic research and visual communication, to foster encounters, dialogues and cultural exchanges around the topics of migration, identity and coexistence.

AFTERNOON PROGRAM



The afternoon features a **series of salons**, in which the public is invited to delve deep into the creative worlds of each artist, actively engaging with them to participate in unique, cutting-edge and avant-garde sonic adventures.

The day concludes with a collective gathering to reflect, share observations, and discuss the day's events. A visual report will serve as the final long-lasting outcome of the day.
